

A Word from the Pastor



Our yearly theme is "Be Strong in the Lord and in the Power of His Might." In March we are considering the sub-theme: "Be Strong in the Lord by Girding Up Your Loins with Truth." This theme is based on Ephesians 6:14: "Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth..."

"Girding" means to prepare for action, to muster up one's resources for the battle. In Jesus' day, men wore robes or tunics that could get in the way if they needed to move quickly or work hard. In battle, it was particularly important that the soldier was not hindered by his tunic. It could cost him his life if he stumbled or tripped.

The loin is the upper part of the thigh and so when the tunic was wrapped up and around the groin area and then tucked into the belt, it was called "girding up the loins."

With this knowledge, we can see that Paul in Ephesians 6:14 is challenging each one of us as soldiers of Christ to be well prepared and equipped to "fight the good fight of faith" (Timothy 6:12). He calls us to do this by surrounding ourselves with truth. Truth is what holds all the other pieces of the Armor of God together.



Now more than ever, we need to gird our loins with truth. The past several years have been filled with fear, uncertainty, anxiety, and confusion. Even

as Saints of the Most High God, it has been difficult to keep our minds free from these negative emotions. The darkness and the lies are ever thicker around us. It is time to gird our loins with truth so that we are not overcome.

God's truth is unchanging. It is a sure and steadfast foundation. The truth of God is powerful enough to overcome all the darkness, each fear, and every lie of the adversary.

How can we gird our loins with truth each day so that we are ready to face the battle? Doctrine and Covenants 83:7b says, "For the word of the Lord is truth..." To gird our loins with truth means we must daily fill our minds with the Word of God. There is no other source of truth.

Nephi said, "I know that the words of truth are hard against all uncleanness; but the righteous fear them not, for they love the truth, and are not shaken" (2 Nephi 6:78).

Standing on the truth of God, girding it about our loins, we shall not be shaken. Let us put on the Whole Armor of God (see Ephesians 6:10-18) that we may be able to withstand in the evil day. Then no matter what comes, we will be victorious in Christ and need not fear.

God has given us a wonderful promise: "And this is mine everlasting covenant, that when thy posterity shall **embrace the truth**, and look upward, then shall Zion look downward, and all the heavens shall shake

with gladness, and the earth shall tremble with you" (Genesis 9:22).

With the Psalmist, may we all say, "I have chosen the way of truth." (Psalms 119:30)

# **Blessings** --- by Chris Allen

We receive blessings every day, but do we recognize them? Below are some of the blessings that were received, or recognized, over the past few weeks while Mom and I were sick.



- I stocked the kitchen supplies at church before Christmas. Sam's Club had everything we needed, which has not always been the case lately with supply chain issues. When I got sick, I didn't have to wonder if they had everything for the priesthood retreat; everything was stocked.
- I work at Lake City and they normally shut down between Christmas and New Year's. This year was the first year we were not going to do inventory during shutdown and I had a list of things to get done at home. Unfortunately, I ended up getting sick. The blessing was that I did not have to take time off work.
- This year we did inventory on November 6<sup>th</sup> instead of during Christmas shutdown. Who knew that was a blessing? I am a key person at inventory and during shutdown I didn't have the energy to walk into the building, let alone give direction to those helping with inventory.
- Mom fell December 20<sup>th</sup> and went to the ER. She didn't get hurt during the fall, but found out that her cold was actually bacterial pneumonia. This allowed her to start getting treatment.

- Mom had been sick for a few days before going to the ER and her apartment needed cleaned. She called a friend and asked her if she would clean her apartment so that it would be ready when she returned after rehab. Although she did not return to the apartment it was a huge blessing when I went in to pack everything up and get it ready to turn the keys in. (I didn't have to clean.)
- On December 27<sup>th</sup> I found out I had pneumonia. I still wasn't feeling well on January 3<sup>rd</sup> and the question I kept getting asked was if I had had a COVID test. Lisa Postlethwait took me for a test on January 4<sup>th</sup>. When we got back to my house, we took my pulse/oxygen and she helped give me the push that I needed to go to the ER. That is where they found I had blood clots in my lungs and we started treatment.
- On January 10<sup>th</sup> I received the call that Mom was tired and wanted to go on comfort care. This was a hard call to take, but I was blessed in that I was feeling much better. I was also allowed to be with her while she passed since Mom was COVID positive.
- I called Elder Mark Nunn to give him an update on Mom and he said he would come to the hospital so I didn't have to be alone. If they wouldn't let him up then he would be sitting downstairs waiting for me. We were both blessed that he was allowed up to Mom's room and he was able to administer to her. I was blessed to have someone there with me while Mom passed. My family was happy to hear that I did not have to go through that alone.
- Mom's passing was quick and she didn't have to struggle for a long time.
- Mom was able to make all of her decisions to the end.
- Mom only had living needs at her apartment so it only took a couple of days to pack everything.
   We did the hard part three years ago when she moved (and she had to help).
- We put Mom's furniture on "Marketplace" on Thursday morning. Everything was sold and picked up by 6:30pm Friday. My sister was surprised that within 24 hours it was sold and gone. I counted it as another blessing.
- All of the prayers, cards and texts were a blessing. I cannot imagine what people do that do not have a church family.

Be encouraged—Be directed—God may show us what He wants us to do through dreams and visions.


Our TOTAL DEDICATION is due to our relationship with Him and KNOWING His direction.



# "Just for You" — by Sheri Nunn (See Ephesians 6:10-14)

When I was in high school, I attended a youth camp at Camp Santa Fe at the Lake of the Ozarks. On the last evening of the camp everyone was down at the lodge getting ready to watch a movie. I had been thinking about what the camp pastor had said earlier in the week. He had asked us to prepare ourselves before the final worship service as though Christ would be there to meet us. I felt that staying and watching the movie wouldn't allow me to prepare to meet Christ so I walked to the tabernacle to meditate and pray.

The sun had almost set and it was dusk as I entered the tabernacle. After I sat and prayed for a while, I walked back to my cabin and read the notes I'd written from a class that day. As I was walking, the still small voice in my mind very strongly told me to go to the cabin and <u>Do Not Look Behind You!</u> From past experiences I knew to obey this prompting without doubting.

After five or ten minutes of reading my notes, one of my friends walked into the cabin. She was really scared and crying. She said, "I watched you walk into the cabin. I have this feeling of evil I can't get rid of and I have had some really bad thoughts about people I know. Then I saw you and I struggled to follow you."

The notes I had been reading were just the words she needed to hear at that moment. A dream I had been given earlier came to my mind; in that dream, Christ comforted me with an embrace. So I put my arms around her and whispered in her ear, "Jesus loves you very much. You'll never know exactly how much. Even if you had been the only one He had to die for to save you from your sins, He would have done it; Just For You!"

I felt God's pure love as in my dream when Christ put His arms around me. I then sensed this love flow from me to her. She felt it too! She asked me to not mention to anyone the thoughts she was having or what happened, as it would embarrass her. I did as she asked.

The next morning, during the worship service, the camp pastor prayed. He asked that

Christ would be among us, then paused for several minutes. Then he called my name and told me I had been given the gift of love. He said that my growing up in the neighborhood that I had was for a purpose, and that It would be a strength to me in years to come.

I knew Jesus was talking to me through the pastor. The Christ-like love I had felt the night before with my friend was fresh on my mind. He addressed a few questions I had prayed silently about at the tabernacle the night before specifically. Only Jesus knew those questions and He spoke to me through our camp pastor.

Reflecting back some 46 years, I have seen how the conditions I grew up in as a child have been and continue to be a source of great strength to me. Many people seem to always be caught up in their own lives, jobs and families, and it is hard for them to take time to reach out to others or keep in touch. The conditions of my childhood created a desire in me to reach out to others and keep in written contact with many of my friends, both old and new.

It gave me strength to cope with being separated by distance from family and friends as a military spouse and mother. Over the years I have lost contact with some of the many friends I have made while we were in the military. However, I have had the joy of finding and reuniting with a lot of my lost friends in recent years. Now, after my husband retired and we moved back to the Center Place, I am making new friends.

I look forward with hope to a joyous reunion with more friends that I have been separated from. I have hope in the renewal of my friendships with those who have passed on before me when we meet again in Zion.

For now I can only work on my life in preparation to meet once again with our Creator, God the Father and especially Jesus, my Lord and Savior who "... loves each of us very much. We will never know exactly how much. Even if you had been the only one He had to die for to save you from your sins, He would have done it; Just For You!"
