Come to Know Truth

The theme for March and April is "Come to Know Truth." This is drawn from the book of Alma. The story unfolds as the sons of Mosiah preach to the Lamanites, convincing them of the truth of Jesus Christ. Alma 14:16 says, "Therefore, we have named all the cities of the Lamanites in which they did repent and come to the knowledge of the truth and were converted."

This is a very timely message for our day and age. For, much like in the days of the Lamanites, there are countless people in our day that are deceived and lost in this world. People have built their own truth upon shifting sands and the very foundations of what they thought was truth are eroding around them. The prophet Isaiah spoke about this dilemma in Isaiah 59:4, 14-15. He said, "None calleth for justice, nor any pleadeth for truth; they trust in vanity and speak lies; they conceive mischief and bring forth iniquity. ... And judgment is turned away backward, and justice standeth afar off; for truth is fallen in the street, and equity cannot enter. Yea, truth faileth; ..."





Building Committee News — by Eric English

In the fourth quarter of 2022, the Building Committee brought forward a proposal to the branch to allocate approximately \$28,000 to modernize a significant portion of our church building lighting to LED.



This proposal was approved, and during the months of November and December over 100 lights were replaced in classrooms, hallways, all of the basement, as well as exterior wall packs and pole lights.

Getting this completed in 2022 enabled us to quality for almost \$8,000 in rebates and we also expect to see a reduction in our monthly utility bill. Have you noticed how bright the new lights are? This project will also allow us to avoid the need to replace bulbs and ballasts over time.

There were opportunities to learn to solder with a soldering iron. Some taught the rest how to sweat copper pipe.

Many participated in the hidden transmitter hunt, using their radios to zero in on the signal. Eric English hid the transmitter in the church and the only clue provided was that it was either on the main floor or in the basement.

A good time was had by all!

Kenya Older Youth Retreat — by April Smith

On December 27-31, 2022, an Older Youth Retreat was held in Awasi, Kenya, at Attenzion School. It was the first Older Youth Retreat to be held in Kenya. Participants were expected to number from 60-80 and reached 91 in attendance! Youth attended from all over Kenya and two even came from Tanzania.

Classes were taught by Eric Odida, Doug Smith, and Aaron Smith and covered doctrinal principles, the Body of Christ, apostasy, restoration, the Bible points to the Book of Mormon, stewardship, forgiveness, prayer, and marriage. A small group prayer time was held each day where many of the youth shared prayer concerns and prayed for each other.

A dedication and commitment service was held on the final night of the retreat and several

of the youth shared actions they plan to take moving forward to be closer to Christ. At the conclusion of the retreat, solar lights from ARM were distributed, so that the youth will be able to have a light for studying if they should lose electricity.

The retreat was viewed as very valuable for these youth as they gathered from many areas across the country and came together as one body. They were strengthened and renewed and are now able to take that strength in the Lord back to their homes, families, work, and school and share the love and light of Christ in new and stronger ways.

The hope is for the Older Youth Retreat to continue in years to come.


