

Jesus told his disciples, "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

As we press forward along the path, it is crucial that we have sure footing. We must have complete faith that when we step forward our feet will be firmly planted and not slip. The gospel of Christ is the firm and solid ground on which we stand. It was preached from the beginning and will continue, unchanged, to the end. 
Baptisms/Confirmations at OGRB

Excerpt from class at OGRB Ladies' Spring Brunch, March 26, 2022

Most of my life, I have believed we were born for a purpose—God's purpose! I am not sure where I got that idea, but I truly believe it.

Recently I have been studying Esther. One of Mordecai's most famous quotes is from **Esther 4:14** "... and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" The king had no idea Esther was a Jew, but she was about to save the entire Jewish nation. God had put her in this place for His purposes.

How do we know we are doing God's will for our lives?

When my first husband passed away from cancer, I was completely lost. I had no career. My children were grown. I believed my entire purpose in life had just ended. Our family was everything to me. I suddenly found myself lost!

I was asked to share my testimony with a group of women. At the end of my testimony I recall saying, "I look forward with great anticipation to what God has in store for me." I sat down, thinking to myself, "Why in the world did I say that?"

You see I had no idea why I had said it, but God did! I was 42 years old and a widow. Not what I had planned.

Many times in the past 30 years I have wondered, as so many in my family passed away, why I was still here. As I sat one Sunday and listened to the sermon I learned the answer to that question. I am still here because I will persevere. Will you persevere? Even when I think I can't, I will turn to God for strength and muddle through. Each one of you is here for a special reason. I do not know what your purpose is, and you may not either, but God knows and it will be revealed to you if you trust him.

Romans 8:28 reads, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose."

There are so many unknowns in life. God had a plan that was far beyond my imagination.

One day I heard a woman on James Dobson's radio program. As I began to listen to this woman tell her story I began to weep. God filled me with such a powerful spirit I knew beyond any doubt this was what he was calling Bob and I to do.

In January of 2010 Bob and I went to Bend, Oregon for training to do a horse therapy program.

That September we filed papers in order to become a non-profit corporation. We were told it could take up to three years. However, by January 11th, we had our non-profit and federal ID number.

You see, God found a way for us to do what He wanted us to do! I was afraid, we didn't have enough money, we didn't know enough, we didn't have the right horses. My fears were many. You see if God is in it, he makes a way. What do you feel compelled to move forward with? First, make sure it is God nudging you. Ask for assurances and discernment.

When I moved back to Missouri from Virginia we decided to open a small cafe in Grain Valley. Looking back, I know beyond any doubt that, although I closed it \$110k in debt, God blessed me and He had a plan for that endeavor. Many people came into my life because of that restaurant. But I will never forget the day Leonard Smith came in. I didn't have any idea who he was. I was introduced to him and he said to me, "You don't understand what this is about. It is about the spiritual things, not the temporal things." And with that he paid his bill and left. That stuck with me as I decided to close out that chapter of my life.

You see God uses all things. Not just the good things, but all things.

We can choose to stay at a dead end stop in our lives or we can ask God where He needs us to be. God can take care of all of it, but He needs steady people—those who are faithful!

This past March, 2022, I went on a work trip to Washington, DC. At the time of the trip, I was working on my class for the CRE Restoration Women's Council. The title of the class was, "God Does Not Give Us the Spirit of Fear."

The coworker that was traveling with me does not go to any church. At one point on the trip she asked me about my class. I shared the topic and the scripture (See Romans 8:28) about all things working together for good. I also talked briefly about how having faith in God helps you not to have fear.



When we were headed back to the airport, we were on a tight schedule. Our driver took us right through the MIDDLE of the Cherry Blossom Festival! It would be like driving through Santa-Cali-Gon on steroids. Why he didn't go around the festival, I don't know. So now we were sitting in traffic, worried we were going to miss our flight. I was praying about the situation. I even shared a testimony with my coworker about Flip and I being stuck in New York traffic prior to our flight to Germany. (Flip had asked me to pray—and the traffic parted!) Even though I shared this and I was praying, I was in a tight knot.

When we finally got to the gate, they were boarding the plane. Once we were in the air, my friend shared that she wasn't worried, because she knew I had been praying. I was struck by this. It was like my friend had more faith in my God then I did. She was calm and collected, I was in a tight knot, even though I knew all things work together for good. If we had not made the flight, there might have been a purpose for that. What if we had to spend another night in DC? I might have had time to share more with my friend about my beliefs. God can use all things for good.

When I returned home, I finished the preparation for my class. One of the books I was reading was

Afraid of All the Things by Scarlet Hiltibidal. In her book she says, "We don't act like children secure in the love of our Father. So often we act like orphans who are desperately looking for love."

Wow! As I thought of my reaction of being all tied up in knots on the way to the airport, I realized that I really wasn't acting like a child of God. I wasn't acting like I believed God would work things out whether we made our flight or not.

As I was finishing my preparation for my class, I happened to listen to Eric Odida's sermon at Oak Grove on March 23, 2022. He said, "We don't act like the children of God. We can't share that we are the children of God with His children, because we don't believe it ourselves. We believe in ourselves, our abilities, our finances and our government."

Essentially, he had the same message that I had just read! Before this, I had always thought I was someone that truly believed in God and that He could do miracles, but I had to contemplate—did I act like someone with true faith? Did I act like a child of God? Sadly, I did not. My friend had more faith in my prayers than I did. Once I had prayed, I should have had peace whether we made the flight or not.

Francis Chan has a quote in <u>Crazy Love</u> that says, "Both worry and stress reek of arrogance. Worry implies that we don't quite trust God is big enough, powerful enough or loving enough to take care of what's happening in our lives." I need to think about that more often. If I am worried and stressed, then I am not trusting God to take care of me.

My hope is that we can all claim our birthright and lose the "orphan" mentality. That we can live like the true children of God that we really are.

And be not conformed to this world; but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God is.




