During the month of July, we are considering the theme, "Seek Submission to the Will of God." Submission is the act of accepting the power or authority of someone else.

Growing up under the guidance of my parents, I found that from time to time I had trouble submitting to their authority. Even though I knew my parents loved me and desired what was best for me, I still had problems sometimes letting go of what I wanted to do and following their guidance. As I grew older, I learned that my life went far more smoothly when I yielded to my parents' authority.

In the same way, our loving and all-knowing Heavenly Father desires for us to acknowledge and submit to His authority so that our lives may be blessed. Submitting to God's will requires us to be willing to let go of our will and yield ourselves to His will. But because of our human nature—the natural man within us—that submission becomes a challenge. We like to think we know what is best for us and our loved ones.

Submitting means we need to become adaptable, flexible, and resilient. Being adaptable is a willingness to change our own ideas and preconceptions as they are revealed to be false by the truth of God. We need to become adaptable as we negotiate all the "noise" of the world around us and allow God to mold us in ways that direct our thoughts and lives toward Him.

Adult Sunday School Class (9:15 to 10:15 a.m., except 1st Sunday)

The theme for May was "I Am Waiting for You, My People, to Sanctify Your Lives" from Chapter 4 of the book *Tell my People*, by Walter Weldon.

There are three key parts in his statement:

- "I am waiting" this implies the Lord's hesitation, waiting to do something...to take action
- "for you my people" very clearly identifies for whom the Lord is waiting
- "to sanctify your lives." the action required by the Lord prior to doing what He is waiting to do

We discussed the definition of *sanctify* and also a number of its opposites, such as *corrupt, tarnish, defile and pollute*.

Another word we considered was *consecration*, which means to make holy or to dedicate to a higher purpose. ... The <u>secr</u> part of **consecrate** comes from the Latin sacer "sacred," so something **consecrated** is dedicated to God and thus is to be considered sacred. When we dedicate our lives wholly and completely to God and His Son Jesus, the process of sanctification – working to sanctify our lives – begins.

We then discussed the three steps taken by followers of Christ:

- 1. Baptism of water
- 2. Baptism by the Spirit
- 3. Sanctification by the blood of Christ

We also focused on the question, "Can men and women sanctify themselves or does God do it all for us?"

The work of sanctification is carried on in the heart of the believer by the cooperation of the human and the Divine: man works, God works. God, in all His dealings with man, in grace, recognizes man as a free agent, capable of receiving or rejecting His grace. Man is not passive, he is active. He must of his own free will yield to the influence of the Spirit of God.

The remainder of the class was a discussion of our individual responsibility in working toward sanctification. This effort includes separating ourselves from every known sin and working to constantly prepare our hearts and minds.

For the month of June, the adult Sunday school class topic was Chapter 5 from the book *Tell my People*, by Walter Weldon. The title of this chapter is **"Tell My People: Keep the Lord's Day Holy."** The first two weeks of the class focused on what it means to keep the Lord's Day holy, necessary work (ox in the ditch), Jesus' example through his ministry and the recognition of the "first day" Christian Sabbath vs. the strict Sabbaths observed in the Old Testament. Modern day revelation in the Doctrine and Covenants gives us an excellent framework on which to base our understanding of the Sabbath day. (See D&C 119:7b-d and D&C 59:2e-g.)

Brother Weldon offers his insights into what the Lord tells us about the Sabbath:

- It is a day of rest.
- It is a day to worship God
- It is a special day to fast and pray.`
- It is a day to gather to hear the word of God.
- It is one of God's commandments.
- The Lord blessed the Sabbath and hallowed it.
- It is a day to glorify God.
- The first day of the week we come together to break bread.
- It is a day to come together to offer sacrifices to God. That offering is a broken heart and a contrite spirit.
- It is a day to pay our devotions unto the Most High.
- Our food is to be prepared with singleness of heart.
- It is a day to confess our sins before the father.
- It is a day to walk uprightly before the Lord.
- We are not to have much laughter and lightmindedness on the Lord's Day.
- It is a day to confess His hand in all things.
- We are not to be weary in doing good works.
- We are to keep all God's laws and commandments.
- It is a day to read and study the scriptures.
- It is a day to visit the sick and afflicted.

The third week of class covered the latter portion of Chapter 5. Brother Weldon asks the question "Are we known today as a special people of God?" and admonishes to come out of Babylon, to keep the commandments, and become a peculiar people for the Lord. Discussion centered on what it takes to become that peculiar people. The world does not see or treat the Sabbath as a holy day, and when we hold it as such, we set ourselves apart.
