

the Pure in Heart, the Peacemakers and Our Response when Persecuted

F Henry Edwards tells us in The Life and Ministry of Jesus that



The Sermon on the Mount has been called 'the moral law of the kingdom of God'. It bears the same general relation to the New Testament that the Ten Commandments bears to the Old Testament. This is not true in every detail, but it is a parallel.... Since the Ten Commandments were given by God for the guidance of ancient Israel, and the instruction contained in the Sermon on the Mount was also given by Divinity for the guidance of the new Israel, these two are related, being motivated by the same spirit and pointed toward the same end. All that is significant in the Ten Commandments is repeated in the Sermon on the Mount but on a much higher plane.

The teaching of the Sermon on the Mount is for spiritually mature men and women.

Oswald Chambers in his book, Studies in the Sermon on the Mount makes this important distinction.

Beware of placing our Lord as Teacher first instead of Savior. We must know Him first as Savior before His teaching can have any meaning...other than that of an ideal that leads to despair. Fancy coming to men and women with defective lives and defiled hearts...and telling them to be pure in heart! What is the use of giving us an ideal we cannot possibly attain?...But if we know Him first as Savior, we know that He did not come to teach us only: He came to make us what He teaches we should be. The Sermon on the Mount is a statement of the life we will live when the Holy Spirit is having His way within us.

Apostle Russell Ralston stated in a sermon

The revelation given through Israel A Smith in **D&C 140:5c,d** reminds us of how important our personal walk with the Lord is:


5c The work of preparation and the perfection of my Saints go forward slowly, and Zionic conditions are no further away nor any closer than the spiritual condition of my people justifies;



Perhaps your heart is healthy but it's broken.

Broken Heart Syndrome is a real medical condition and can happen even if you are healthy. Researchers do not know the exact cause but symptoms are often triggered by extreme stress, such as intense grief, anger or surprise.

Women are more likely than men to experience this condition. Experts think that a surge of stress hormones "stuns" the heart, causing intense, short-lived symptoms that usually don't cause permanent damage to the heart. Most women who experience Broken Heart Syndrome are older, between 58 and 75 years old.



Psalms 147:3 He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds.

In the book, *The Kingdom of Heaven is Like... pg 45-46* Apostle Russell Ralston shared how the sudden death of their little daughter left he and his wife broken hearted.

The shock of our little daughter's sudden passing, the weariness of a long summer's work, the immediate sense of our real loss found us weaker that we had expected. Through that first long night we reasoned. Every answer I had ever given to anyone else in such a time came to mind, but all fell short of our need.

For the first time in our lives we were truly broken-hearted. Through the agonizing hours of that night and the following day we came face to face with the reality that within this world there was no source of real help or strength, this in spite of the many thoughtful expressions of wonderful friendship offered by many good people. In this condition we found that there was only one source of strength, and we turned to Him.

He heard our prayers, and in our time of greatest turmoil came our sweetest peace. Such peace is not physical, but by its very nature is spiritual, lifting man above the woes of this life and giving him a taste of blessings yet to come. Such peace can be ours daily if we permit his spirit to transform us. Such peace must be ours if we are truly to assist in the building up of the kingdom of God, for this peace is part of its basic structure.

3 Nephi 5:66

And behold I have given you the **law and the commandments of my Father**, that ye shall **believe in me**, and that ye shall **repent of your sins**, and come unto me with a **broken heart** and a contrite spirit.

The Hardened Heart



There is a medical term called Stiff Heart Syndrome. A stiff heart occurs when the heart muscle thickens in response to high blood pressure. While initially this thickening helps increase pump function to maintain blood flow to the body, eventually, the pump starts to stiffen and pressure starts to build up in the heart. This can lead to shortness of breath and fluid retention both in the lungs and in the legs.

And now because of their unbelief, they could not understand the word of God; and their **hearts** were **hardened**.

On September 21, 1823 - just over 200 years ago - Moroni came to Joseph Smith and quoted **Joel 2:28-32** and added that this was not yet fulfilled but soon would be

Joel 2:28-32

And it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions; 29 And also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my Spirit. 30 And I will show wonders in the heavens and in the earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke. 31 The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the Lord come. 32 And it shall come to pass, that **whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered;** for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord shall call.

So, as stated by Earl Curry in the Endowment, p8, 14

Can you not see, then, that what is most needed now is...such a generation of men and women, boys and girls, who see these things - whose hearts are touched by the mighty appeal of what they see an Almighty Father can do through them? All other things will fall into place as this generation of spiritual stalwarts arises.

...it is a noble association of deeply consecrated, inspired and gifted minds, humble to know the truth, anxious to glorify His high purpose and name, and deeply concerned, as is He, with the achievement of this **His** high purpose for life.

As F Henry Edwards said in The Life and Ministry of Jesus pg. 86

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Purity of heart is a living purity. It is not innocence, but is the outcome of conflict and the manifestation of strength. The purity of a lily comes from the nature which enables it to extract from the surrounding filth such food as will nurture its own white beauty.

In a similar way, the purity which Jesus smiled on grows and blossoms in spite of surrounding circumstances because it roots are in the life of God.

First, a peacemaker must be able to understand and experience peace personally if they hope to have any influence in bringing peace into the relationships of others.

Isaiah 26:1-2

Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee; because he trusteth in thee. **Trust ye in the Lord forever**; for in the Lord JEHOVAH is everlasting strength.

In **Philippians 4:6-7** we are told what is required to obtain a Godly peace.

Be afflicted for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you; not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid

John 16:33

These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.

Second, a peacemaker is not the same as a peacekeeper.

D&C 42:23a

And if thy brother or sister offend thee, thou shalt take him or her between him or her and thee alone; and if he or she confess, thou shalt be reconciled.

Sometimes peace begins with war.



Alma 21:38-43

- 38 Yea, we see that Amalickiah, because he was a man of cunning devices, and a man of many flattering words, that he led away the hearts of many people to do wickedly;
- 39 Yea, and to seek to destroy the church of God, and to destroy the foundation of liberty which God had granted unto them, or which blessing God had sent upon the face of the land, for the righteous' sake.
- 40 And now it came to pass that when Moroni, who was the chief commander of the armies of the Nephites, had heard of these dissensions, he was angry with Amalickiah.
- 41 And it came to pass that he rent his coat; and he took a piece thereof, and wrote upon it, In memory of our God, our religion, and freedom, and our peace, our wives, and our children; and he fastened it upon the end of a pole thereof.
- 42 And he fastened on his head-plate, and his breastplate, and his shields, and girded on his armor about his loins; and he took the pole, which had on the end thereof his rent coat (and he called it the title of liberty),

There is a widely prevalent idea that those who serve God faithfully can count on him for deliverance from pain and sickness. This is not always true. History is replete with evidences of the unfailing love of God toward his people. He frequently saves those who love him from pain and sorrow. But there are times when to deliver his disciples from lesser evils would be to deliver them over to greater evils, and our Heavenly Father does not do this. He did not deliver his Son in Gethsemane, ...and though Paul was saved from the viper he still had to go to Rome a prisoner in order that there he might preach the word of God.



are ye when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.

For ye shall have great joy, and be exceeding glad; for great shall be your reward in heaven; for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you. Joseph is a wonderful example on how to respond to persecution.

- 1) He was 17 when he was sold into Egypt by his brothers
- 2) He was falsely accused by Potiphar's wife and thrown into prison
- 3) He interpreted the chief Butler's dream but He did not repay Joseph by remembering him to the Pharaoh for 2 years.
- 4) He was 30 when he finally stood before the Pharaoh

Yet, Joseph did not doubt in the dark...what God had revealed in the light. He believed God and held on to his choices....His dreams came true because of his choices."
