
CITY COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING

- Is a contributing building to the Overtown National Register Historic District which was nominated to the register in the areas of ethnic heritage, community planning and development and architecture.
- The building housed a variety of small retail and service businesses during its period of significance 1928 1971. Some of the earliest businesses included the A. Collman and Son Department Store, A.E. White Grocery Store and Messners Bakery.

- By the 1940's service businesses also occupied the building including Hodges and Sellmeyer Plumbing and Bradera Sales Company (radio repair)
- Generally, the businesses in the building provided neighborhood services, often including a department store and grocery.
- Th building is named after Arthur Collman because he operated one of the earliest and longest running businesses in the building (1928 1945) and owned the building at the time of his death in 1960 and likely much earlier.











- The Arthur Collman Commercial Block possesses integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, association and feeling
- It is eligible for listing in the City of Sarasota's Local Register of Historic Places for its exemplification of the broad cultural and social history of the city of Sarasota as a prominent commercial building that served the African American community of Overtown and for its embodiment of the distinctive visual characteristics of the Masonry Vernacular Style of Architecture.
